# TWF & Bloomberg Present a Celebration of Women in Finance: March 19 Panel & Networking Event Focused on Women in Trading and Hedge Funds

Hong Kong, March 7, 2013 – The Women's Foundation, one of Hong Kong's leading NGOs dedicated to the advancement of women, today announced the second event in their Leading Women Speaker Series: a Celebration of Women in Finance with a Focus on Trading and Hedge Funds on Tuesday, March 19. The Leading Women Speaker Series, launched last November in partnership with Bloomberg, is a series of panel discussions examining the opportunities and challenges women face across traditionally male-dominated industry and professional sectors.

The panel will feature the following distinguished speakers:

#### Topics for discussion include:

- \* Why do women make up just 5% of roles in trading and hedge funds?
- \* What barriers to entry and on-going challenges do women in trading and hedge funds face?
- \* What kind of qualifications, skill sets and on the job experience do you need to become a leader in this field? How accessible are these opportunities to women?
- \* Do women bring different qualities to the job compared to men?

Over 150 finance professionals have signed up for the event which will be held at the Bloomberg Auditorium in Central and has the support of B&B Structured Finance, the British Council and Women in Finance Asia (WIFA). A number of seats are reserved for female undergraduates pursuing finance and business degrees and courses at leading local universities.



According to Terri Duhon, a former J.P. Morgan trader and author of, *What Really Happens on the Trading Floor*, "The fact remains that women are the extreme minority on the trading floor, which is a high stress and high energy place. There are few to no women on any given trading desk and the women that are there are still primarily in sales roles."

Following the panel, The Women's Foundation will publish a white paper detailing best practices and recommendations for business, industry associations, educators, parents, and the Government to achieve a more equal playing field for women looking to enter the finance industry or who are already working in the industry.

Su-Mei Thompson, CEO of The Women's Foundation, said "The Women in Finance panel will showcase the experiences of successful local female role models working in trading and hedge funds. We hope the panel will inspire other women in the field to overcome barriers at the ground level all the way through to the glass ceilings preventing them from making it to the very top. The economic future of Hong Kong rests on the strategic use of our human resources. As a leading global financial centre with an abundance of highly educated professional women, Hong Kong has the opportunity to send a powerful message to the world by asserting itself as a modern sophisticated economy that nurtures talent across the workforce."
