#BreakZeroSum Thinking to Advance Gender Equality



Dear TWF Friends,

Hong Kong's competitiveness and development are closely intertwined with gender equality. The benefits are clear and have been long established: Happier families. Better overall business outcomes. A more robust economy.

But our city is far from reaping the benefits of gender equality. Stats released this past quarter reveal only 48% of women participate in the workforce, compared with 64% of men. This is lower than many of our neighbours including Singapore, South Korea, Mainland China, Australia and Japan. Women are 10 times more likely than men to cite household responsibilities as a key reason for not being economic contributors. The gender pay gap is at 15% i.e., for every HK\$10 earned by a man, their female counterpart earns just HK\$8.5. These are but a few of the numerous gender inequalities that continue to permeate areas such as safety, mental health, poverty, and career advancement, among others.

What is preventing us from closing the gender gap?


Girls Go Tech: Work Shadowing

On August 29, our GGT participants joined a full-day Work Shadowing event co-organised by Societe Generale. Throughout the day, our participants had the incredible opportunity to connect with executives from a diverse range of departments at Societe Generale, where they generously shared their insights on STEM-related education and careers. Our participants also engaged in an "Interview the Managers" session - interacting with volunteers in smaller

groups, learning how technology is applied in the workplace and receiving personalised career coaching and advice. Girls Go Tech: English for STEM
