Caroline Erisman is the 10th Head of School at Dana Hall, an all-girls independent boarding and day school for grades 6-12. Previously, she was Associate Head of School at The Hewitt School, an all-girls K-12 school in New York City. She is currently a Trustee at Beacon Academy in Boston, and has also served as a Trustee of the Shady Hill School in Cambridge, Mass and The Town School in New York City. After graduating Phi Beta Kappa from all-women's Wellesley College with a bachelor's degree in classical civilisation, Caroline went on to earn a master's degree in curriculum and teaching from Columbia University's Teacher's College and a J.D. from the New York University School of Law.
