Ms. Thompson started her career at Linklaters in 1989 where she specialized in corporate finance and international capital markets work in the firm's London, Paris and Hong Kong offices. She joined Walt Disney Television Asia-Pacific in 1996 as Regional Director for Legal & Business Affairs. Upon leaving Disney in 2000, Ms Thompson joined Asiacontent.com as their General Counsel and Senior Vice-President for Corporate and Business Development. From 2003 to 2007, Ms Thompson worked at the Financial Times as the FT's Managing Director for Asia and served on the FT's global management board. In this role, she oversaw the launch of the FT's dedicated Asian edition in print and online, the FT's Chinese language website and the FT's conferences business in the region and successfully advanced the FT's strategy and relationships in India and China. From 2007 to 2008, Ms Thompson served as Senior Vice-President of Strategic Business Development at Christie's. In 2009, she co-founded Intelligence Squared Asia - the Asia arm of the global forum for political, economic and cultural debate. She is a non-executive director for Save The Children in Hong Kong and a Corporate Member of The Cheltenham Ladies College.

Ms. Thompson earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in law from Trinity College, Cambridge University in 1987 and a first-class Masters degree in law (B.C.L.) from Christchurch, Oxford University in 1989. She holds an M.B.A. from IMD in Lausanne in 2001 where she was the first woman to graduate on The Dean's List. She has also served as a lecturer and tutor in contract and commercial law at King's College, University of London.

The Women's Foundation also announced that its 2009 Leadership Awards and Fundraising Dinner will take place on October 15, 2009 at the W Hotel, Kowloon. TWF's annual Leadership Awards honor female leaders in the fields of politics, philanthropy, academia, research and student life who have made a significant contribution to improving the position of women and girls in Hong Kong.
