
We have compiled a list of some of the activities we are looking forward to:

Fiona Nott
CEO of the Women's Foundation, Fiona Nott has been advocating for women since finishing law school in Australia and being appointed to the Women's Advisory Council of New South Wales. In 2009, Nott co-founded Roots to Roots' Hong Kong Chapter and regional programme offices in six, the Foundation's first international Chapter. Women in Business Network Series was also born from The Women's Foundation. Fiona served on Boards Steering Committee, joining the 90% Club and then, in 2017, becoming the organization's CEO. Since the appointment, TWF has doubled the number of female founders and managers. It now encourages all senior business leaders to advance gender equality; Boardroom Series for Women Leaders, which has successfully pushed for the appointment of 50 females on boards since its very first Gender Equality Summit in 2009; and a number of research studies that have influenced public and private sector policies.

Survey Participation: Women's Experiences of Violence 2021

TWF is pleased to support a survey from The Hong Kong Women's Coalition on Equal Opportunities in collaboration with the Zonta Club of Kowloon and Lingnan University on Women's Experiences of Violence. The survey aims to collect data on the prevalence of sexual violence, intimate partner violence, and image based sexual violence against women in Hong Kong, as well as women's experiences of them. The survey targets women aged 15 years old and above who are residents of Hong Kong. Findings from the study will help inform community education and policy advocacy to combat violence against women. We encourage anyone eligible to participate.
